English

This week we are going to focus on using film to stimulate our creative ideas. You will need to use the following link to complete the activities:

- Pause the film after 40 seconds (just when the lighthouse keeper is at his desk). Can you describe the setting in only 3 sentences? Try to still be as creative as possible, use fronted adverbials and exciting adjectives.
- Pause the film again after the candle blows out.
 Do you think the lighthouse keeper likes his neighbours? Write a character description from the lighthouse keeper's point of view about his neighbours.
- Pause the film after the lighthouse keeper sees the ship. How do you think he feels when he sees the ship? Write a short passage that uses inference to tell the reader his emotions.
- Pause the film when the lighthouse keeper gets to the bottom of the steps. Write a prediction of what you think will happen by the end of the video clip.
- Watch up to the end. Do you think the lighthouse keeper now feels differently about his neighbours?
 Edit your character description from before to show his change in opinion.

Mental Maths!


Use an egg timer (or any timer) to time solving these questions in 3 minutes.

- Share 9 dog biscuits between 2 dogs. How many does each dog get?
- Write one number that is a multiple of 2 and also a multiple of 3.

- 1. Maia sent postcards to her friends in England. Write a postcard she could have sent to her friend.
- How does she feel?
- What will she write about?


Gem Power
