Topic Subjects

Our Foundation Subject Topic this term is 'Remember, Remember' We will be learning all about Guy Fawkes and Bonfire night as well as The Wright Brothers and their amazing inventions.

Please find below some of the key facts that your child will learn. We will use these facts in our quick recall quizzes and we will be referring back to them over the term. Ask your child about these questions at home to help them remember the knowledge!

<u>Guy Fawkes</u>

- Guy Fawkes tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament in 1605.
- Bonfire Night is celebrated every year on 5th November to remember this event.

The Wright Brothers

- The Wright brothers were the first people to fly an airplane in 1903.
- Their invention changed how people travel and made flying possible.

Question Prompts to use when reading with your child

The Book Introduction

Relate the story to the children's own experience (fiction)


Tap into the children's prior knowledge of the subject (non-fiction)

Very brief overview of the story without revealing too much

Look at front cover and encourage prediction - Who? Where? What?

Look at back cover and blurb

Look at illustrations



Simple Comprehension Questions

What do you think is happening here?
What happened in the story?
What might this mean?
Through whose eyes is the story told?
Which part of the story best describes the setting?
What words and/or phrases do this?
What part of the story do you like best?



Recall Questions

Where does the story take place?
When did the story take place?
What did he/she look like?
Who was he/she?
Where did he/she live?
Who are the characters in the book?
Where in the book would you find ...?



Investigative Questions

What makes you think that?
What words give you that impression?
How do you feel about...?
Can you explain why ...?
I wonder what the writer intended?
I wonder why the writer decided to...?
What do these words mean and why do you
