There was once a man who didn't have any friends (none!) It wasn't because he was short, it wasn't because he was a tax collector (although, he was both of these). It was because he was **dishonest**. He collected more taxes than he should have and kept the money for himself! He made himself a rich man by stealing other people's money! People knew what he was up to, but he was powerful, so they didn't dare say anything. So, Zacchaeus (because that was his name) had no friends – nobody liked him, and nobody trusted him!

One day, a huge crowd had gathered because they had heard that Jesus was coming to town. Now Zacchaeus had heard about Jesus too and really wanted to see him – there was something Jesus had said that had planted a seed in his heart. Nobody would let Zacchaeus get to the front of the crowd to see him (which wasn't surprising as no one liked him), and he couldn't see over everyone's heads but he had a good idea. He climbed up a nearby tree so that he could get a better look. In fact, he had a perfect view! When Jesus came alongside the tree, he saw Zacchaeus and called up to him by name- yes, Jesus knew his name- and told him that he wanted to come to his house!

Needless to say, the people were quite cross that Jesus wanted to spend time which such a dishonest man, so they booed him and shouted hurtful names. Jesus knew exactly what he was doing though, and once inside his house, Zacchaeus confessed all the bad things he had done because he felt so ashamed! "To be **truthful** with others, you must first be **truthful** with yourself" Anon


## Lord God,

The truth is still the truth, even if no one believes it. A lie is still a lie, even if everyone believes it.







## Where can we find other stories about Honesty?
