What are the Access and Response team in South Gloucestershire?

The Access and Response Team in South Gloucestershire is like your safety net outside of school hours. They're a group of experts trained to handle any worries you might have about your child's (or another child's) well-being when they're not in school. Whether it's concerns at home or in the community, 'ART' are there to take your call and listen to your concerns. So, if something's potentially worrying you about a child's safety and wellbeing, don't hesitate to reach out. You can give them a call on their helpline or get in touch through the local authority.
