

My friends





Special people in my life




Draw a picture of you doing that job when you are grown up.

I can write my numbers to 20





#### Kites Tricky Word Colouring




Colour in the tricky words which you can read straight away. Leave the others that you find hard to read. You might like to see if you can work on some of these over Summer?

Count the number of each type of seaside item needed in the addition number sentences. Write the numbers in the boxes to create and then solve












Look carefully at the seaside objects in the **I spy** picture. Can you count how many you see and then add them up using the pictures and symbols on the page here?
