done*

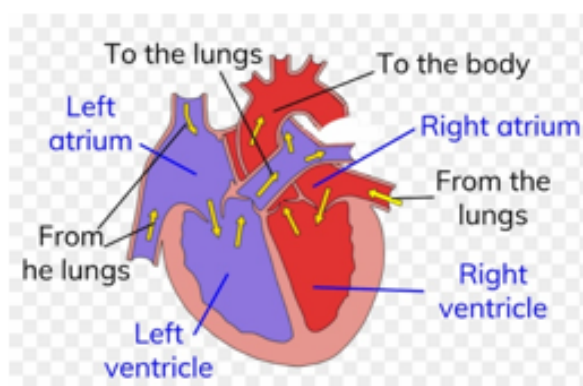
*Watching over all that's happening, the local

# The Human Heart.

Our heart is a very important organ that takes the unoxygenated air and mixes it with blood then takes it to the lungs and then it becomes oxygenated air. After that it travels all around our body and out of our nose without the blood and this all happens in one single breath. The heart has four main parts to it. The hearts four pieces are in each corner of the heart



and the top two are called the left and right atrium, the bottom two are the left and right ventricle. The system of this is the air goes into the left atrium then through a tube to the left ventricle then it all travels to the lungs and back out but this time it's on the other side in the right atrium and then to the right ventricle and off to the body then out of the body in a single breath. In the middle of the heart there is a muscular barrier called

septa or septum. The heart is protected by our ribcages and it is on the left side of our chest.
