Year 3 Term 1 2024/25



In Maths this term we will develop our understanding of place value. We will be solidifying our knowledge of representing and partitioning numbers up to 100, before moving onto numbers up to 1000. We will also be looking at finding more or less, comparing and ordering numbers to 1000.

Topic Subjects

Our Foundation Subject Topic this term is 'Mad about Maya' We will be learning all about the Ancient Mayan civilisation from 2000BC to 1500AD. During our topic, we will be finding out what life was like during Mayan times, what the Mayans believed and how they wrote. We will also be learning all about teeth and digestion, including a very exciting experiment!

Please find below some of the key facts that your child will learn. We will use these facts in our quick recall quizzes and we will be referring back to them over the term. Ask your child about these questions at home to help them remember the knowledge!

SOME KEY MAYAN FACTS

- The Maya were a civilisation who lived in Central America between approximately 1700BC and 900AD
- They grew crops such as; cacao, avocado and beans.
- Maya cities were filled with temples, palaces and monuments
- Maya writing (also known as hieroglyphs) was one of the earliest forms of writing in the world.
- The Maya people believed in many Gods.
- The King and the royal family were believed to be related to the Gods.

Home learning Expectations

Home Reading – Please ensure your child reads at least 5 times a week at home. Please prioritise this as this is proven to be the most impactful for children and their learning in school.

Maths –Times Table Rock Stars practise (Years 2 to 6) – a total of at least 20 minutes on 'Garage mode'.

Spellings – Please practise the weekly spellings at home to support the learning in school (Years 1-6) - around 15 minutes in total.

Please ensure you record evidence of your home learning in your home learning books so that you receive your 'Home Learning Hero' time!



We also ask that you read at least 5 times a week to develop your comprehension and fluency. In the coming weeks, we will be giving out login details for children to use on 'Purple Mash'. This is an online platform for those children who wish to practise their English and Maths even more at home! 😊



We are excited to invite you to join us in fostering a love of reading among our young learners at The Manor. Reading is a crucial skill that forms the foundation for lifelong learning. The Book Introduction

Relate the story to the children's own experience (fiction)

Tap into the children's prior knowledge of the subject (non-fiction)

Very brief overview of the story without revealing too much

Look at front cover and encourage prediction - Who? Where? What?

Look at back cover and blurb

Look at illustrations

Recall Questions

Where does the story take place?

When did the story take place?

What did he/she look like?

Who was he/she?

Where did he/she live?

Who are the characters in the book?

Where in the book would you find ...?
