Hello everyone! We would like to say well done to all of our children for making such a fantastic start to the new school year. They have settled into school life brilliantly and have made excellent progress in their learning – we couldn't be more proud of them!

A few reminders before we kick off the new year!

Reading

Everyone has made a fantastic start with their reading and it is great to see so many children practising their sounds and reading books at home. Please keep this up – it makes all the difference.

This term we move on to teaching the rest of the single letters in the alphabet: e u r h b f l j v w x y z before moving on to digraphs (two letters which make one sound).

Maths

In Maths this term, we continue to develop our sense of numbers up to 5. We will count up to 5 objects, subitise 4 and 5, find different ways to make and represent 4 and 5, whilst also reminding ourselves of what one more and one less means.



We are still learning to read these tricky words instantly: no, go, I, the, into, to and will be introducing new words – you are he we me

Please also note the handwriting scheme that we use is a great 5 min activity to help children develop letter formation. Here is the login and password:






Can we also remind you that there is a film clip of us saying the sounds and actions on our website if you ever feel like you need a bit of extra help.

Question Prompts to use when reading with your child

The Book Introduction

Relate the story to the children's own experience (fiction)


Tap into the children's prior knowledge of the subject (non-fiction)

Very brief overview of the story without revealing too much

Look at front cover and encourage prediction - Who? Where? What?

Look at back cover and blurb


Look at illustrations



Simple Comprehension Questions

What do you think is happening here?
What happened in the story?
What might this mean?
Through whose eyes is the story told?
Which part of the story best describes the setting?

What words and/or phrases do this?
What part of the story do you like best?



Recall Questions

Where does the story take place?
When did the story take place?
What did he/she look like?
Who was he/she?
Where did he/she live?
Who are the characters in the book?
Where in the book would you find ...?



Investigative Questions

What makes you think that?

What words give you that impression?
How do you feel about...?
Can you explain why ...?
I wonder what the writer intended?
I wonder why the writer decided to...?
What do these words mean and why do you think the author chose them?
Has the author used adjectives to make this character funny?
Why did the author choose this setting?
