English

In English this term we will be using the book Wombat goes Walkabout as inspiration. We will retell the story



and invent our own version whilst continuing to build our awareness of basic punctuation A key focus will be full stops and capital letters alongside letter formation.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths this term we will develop our understanding of addition. We will be looking at different strategies to solve addition problems such as part, part whole models and counting on.

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<u>Topic Subjects</u>

Our Foundation Subject Topic this term is 'Remember, Remember'. We will begin by learning all about The Gunpowder Plot, Guy Fawkes and how this relates to Bonfire Night celebrations nowadays. We will also be revisiting our art learning from Term 1 by creating Quentin Blake-style portraits of Guy Fawkes.

Later in the term, we will be learning about David Attenborough. We will be looking at his life and his involvement in conservation. We will also be learning about the world's oceans and how we can take care of them.

Please find below some of the key facts that your child will learn. We will use these facts in our quick recall quizzes and we will be referring back to them over the term. Ask your child about these questions at home to help them remember the knowledge!

Robert Catesby was a Catholic who didn't agree with the Protestant faith of the King and plotted to kill him.

Guy Fawkes was involved in the Gunpowder Plot. He was arrested in the cellar of the Houses of Parliament on the day he was going to light the gunpowder, 5 November. King James I declared that 5 November should be the day that people always celebrate that the Gunpowder Plot didn't happen.

David Attenborough is a natural historian and broadcaster. He introduced millions of people to a variety of animals around the world. David Attenborough is an important climate change campaigner. He has won many awards for his work in broadcasting.

Question Prompts to use when reading with your child

The Book Introduction

Relate the story to the children's own experience (fiction) Tap into the children's prior knowledge of the subject (non-fiction) Very brief overview of the story without revealing too much Look at front cover and encourage prediction - Who? Where? What? Look at back cover and blurb Look at illustrations

Recall Questions

Where does the story take place? When did the story take place? What did he/she look like? Who was he/she? Where did he/she live? Who are the characters in the book? Where in the book would you find ...?

Simple Comprehension Questions

What do you think is happening here? What happened in the story? What might this mean? Through whose eyes is the story told? Which part of the story best describes the setting? What words and/or phrases do this? What part of the story do you like best?

Investigative Questions

What makes you think that?
