Mavis the Magical Cat has been put together in a very similar format to one we would use in class. It provides a variety of fun tasks to help children learn about the different elements of a story.

This week we would like it if you could all:-

- share the story with an adult (p4)
- talk about the characters (p6)
- look at the meaning of some of the words (p7)
- have a go at 'let's pretend' (p8)
- try and learn the rhyme (p9) and ask an adult to film you and send it in via the 2buildaprofile app.
- share the Happy poem (p13). Can you tell Mummy or Daddy which words rhyme? If they read the poem to you again, can you work out the missing rhyming word?

Next week, we will explore further parts of the books together.

<u>Maths</u>

- 1. Write down numbers from 0 to 20 on separate pieces of paper/card.
- 2. Ask someone else to hide the numbers around the house or garden (no peeking).
- 3. See if you can find the numbers and place them in a number line as and when you find them. For instance, if you find 0 first and then 20, think about where they would go on the line.
- 4. Can you tell someone one more than a number that they call out, one less than a number that they call out?
- 5. Challenge: roll a dice (or ask someone to shout out a number from 1 6). Starting at 20, count backwards and make the same amount of jumps.

ie. Daddy shouts out 'five'. Starting at 20 you jump back five spaces and hopefully land on 15. So, 20 take away 5 equals 15.



<u>Topic</u>

Have a go at creating a rainbow picture from the Mavis Magical cat book using elastic bands or other objects. Be creative! You could use pieces of fruit, vegetable, sponge, duplo to print your colours?

If you don't have paint, could you make a rainbow with different coloured toys, objects, leaves, clothing?

Gem Power Challenge	Your Gem Power Challenge this week is to use some Ruby Power to focus on a task with a grown up and show them that you are listening and looking at them. This is called active listening. Can you tell a grown up what you have done well with your learning?
	 Ruby Power I actively listen to others when they talk - I use my eyes and ears. My positive learning behaviour allows others to learn.
	 I recognise my own successes and accept praise from others. I can pick out examples of what I have done well. I encourage others to learn and praise them when they've been successful, saying what it is they did to be successful.
	• I understand how others might feel when they make a mistake, or are disappointed; I try to cheer them up.
	 I notice when others need help and I offer to support them. I can talk about my positive qualities as a learner and as a person. I can recognise qualities in others that make them capable learners and good people.
