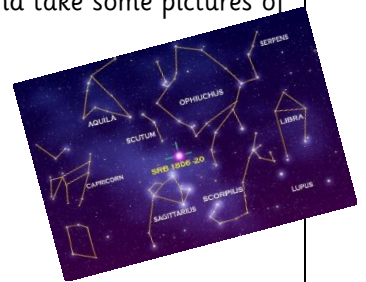
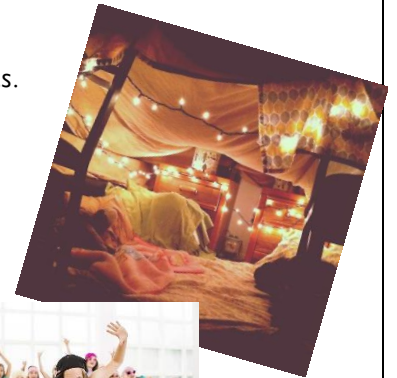


Year 3 Week 8

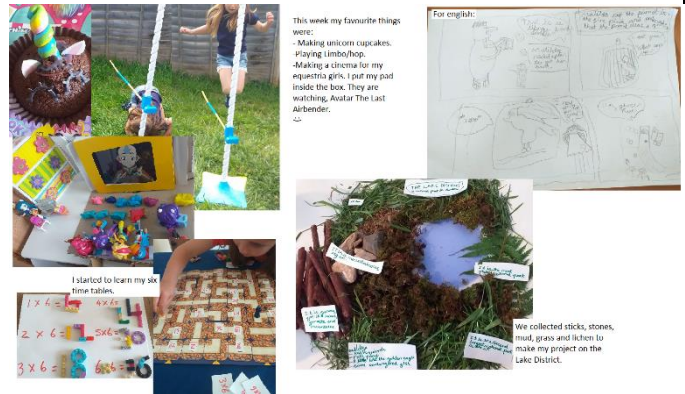
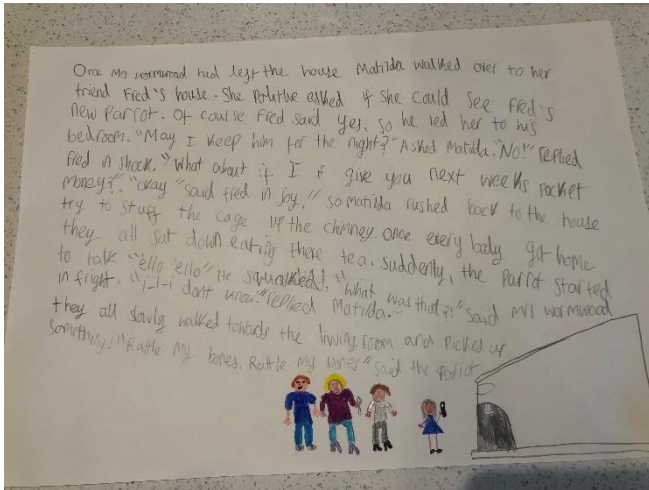

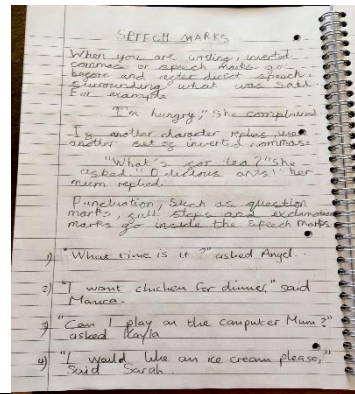
