
#### Maths

In Maths this term we will develop our understanding of place value. We will be counting forwards and backwards, identifying 1 more and 1 less of any given number and developing our understanding of the composition of numbers up to and including 10. We will also be developing our addition and subtraction understanding by exploring the part whole structure and bar models. We will be looking at the relationship between addition and subtraction.




## Topic Subjects

Our Foundation Subject Topic this term is 'Off With Her Head!' We will be learning all about the Tudor period in England from 1485 to 1603. During our topic, we will be finding out what life was like in Tudor times, creating self-portraits and even designing and building our own castles!

# Question Prompts to use when reading with your child



#### The Book Introduction

Relate the story to the children's own experience (fiction)


Tap into the children's prior knowledge of the subject (non-fiction)

Very brief overview of the story without revealing too much

Look at front cover and encourage prediction - Who? Where? What?

Look at back cover and blurb

Look at illustrations



## Simple Comprehension Questions

What do you think is happening here? What happened in the story? What might this mean?

Through whose eyes is the story told?
Which part of the story best describes the setting?
What words and/or phrases do this?

What part of the story do you like best?



## Recall Questions

Where does the story take place?
When did the story take place?
What did he/she look like?
Who was he/she?
Where did he/she live?
Who are the characters in the book?
Where in the book would you find ...?



#### Investigative Questions

What makes you think that?
What words give you that impression?
How do you feel about...?
Can you explain why ...?
I wonder what the writer intended?
I wonder why the writer decided to...?
What do these words mean and why do you think the author chose them?
Has the author used adjectives to make this character funny?
Why did the author choose this setting?
