
If you have any questions please speak with any member of the Senior Leadership Team or see your child's teacher at the end of the school day.

We would also like to remind our families that we are a nut-free school. Some of our children suffer with various allergies and so in order to keep everyone safe, we ask that you do not include food items containing nuts in your child's lunch box or as a break time snack.

We would also like to reiterate that as your child is in KS1, they receive a healthy snack provided by school. We therefore ask that all children in KS1 (Year R - 2) **do not** bring in an additional snack. As a healthy school, we also ask that children are not given sweets in their packed lunches (such as Haribo) to eat during lunchtime. Thank you for your support with this.

English

In English this term, we will be looking at the story 'The Way Back Home' by Oliver Jeffers. We will be looking at how we can enhance our sentences through adding additional clauses and using varying vocabulary.



Maths

This term we will be deepening our understanding of number. We will be learning how to write numbers in words and counting in 5s. We will be using our numberbonds to 20 to solve missing number problems. We will continue to look at arrays to solve multiplication and division problems. We will end this term by looking at money, recognising coins and notes and counting money.

We kindly ask that you read with your children at least 5 times a week. We ensure an adult reads with your child as often as possible in school but it is crucial that your child practises at home as well to develop their fluency, intonation and comprehension.

Foundation Subjects


Our topic this term is "Cracking Contraptions"


It's an exciting topic where we will be learning all about the Wright Brothers and their journey in becoming the first people to successfully create and fly aircraft. We will be thinking about why these people and their determination are still significant today and how aircraft has developed throughout the years. We will also be learning about human geography in Spain, with a focus on the amazing architecture that can be found there. We will then be studying the Bristol-based animation studio 'Aardman' and thinking about the methods used to create successful stopmotion clay animations.

Please refer to your child's 'Cracking Contraptions' knowledge organiser to better understand what your child is learning about in school.


Term 5 'Cracking Contraptions' Reading Spine
