

(insects have 6 legs, spiders have 8 legs, some have more legs (centipede), slugs and snails have a foot.

what it eats

(some minibeasts feed off nectar, plants or other bugs)

• It's lifecycle

(frogspawn — tadpoles - froglets — frogs/caterpillar - cocoon butterfly)




