- Rosa Parks was born in America in 1913.
- She attended segregated schools when she was a child.
- When she was growing up, Rosa felt that it was unfair and wanted equality.
- In 1955, when Rosa refused to give up her seat on a bus to a white passenger, Rosa was arrested.
- This started the Montgomery Bus Boycott.
- A year later, a court ruled that buses no longer needed to use segregation.

Carnivore - an animal that eats only meat


Herbivore – an animal that eats only plants
