English

Think of a character from one of your favourite stories. It could be the mouse from The Gruffalo, Lanky Len or Hefty Hugh from What the ladybird heard or any other character you can think of. Write a character description about that character. Write about what they look like, what they are like and how they behave. Remember to include lots of adjectives to describe them.

Spelling

Practise these different Year 1 spelling words:

- mouse
- any
- many
- asked
- who
- people

You may want to practise them by using a paint brush and water. You can write the words using the water on a chalk board, paper or patio and once the water dries the spellings will disappear!

Reading

After reading The Bog Baby try to answer the following questions:

What did Chrissy and her sister do instead of go to Annie's house?

Do you think it was bad that they went to the magic pond? Why?

How did the girls care for the Bog Baby? Why did the Bog Baby get ill?

Could you design a new front cover for the book? What might you include?

Maths


You could practise counting in 10's. Start by writing the numbers in the 10 x table on bits of paper. Can you order them? How about taking some away and working out which are the missing numbers.



You could also try working with fractions. Start by drawing some shapes. Colour a $\frac{1}{2}$ of those shapes. Can you colour them in different ways? Remember the 2 parts need to be equal.

Now try and find a $\frac{1}{2}$ of an amount of objects. Collect some objects from around the house and use these to find a half. For example $\frac{1}{2}$ of 8 is 4.

CHALLENGE: Can you find a half of 5, 7 and 9? Why/why not?

Topic

This week we will be focussing on viewpoints, both physical viewpoints and personal viewpoints – their own viewpoint and those of others. The activities below could help to develop this. For further ideas please take a look at the Robin Hood Mat Learning Projects.

<u>Using your senses</u>: Ask your child to pick a window in the house. Ask them to stand there for a few minutes and take a look at what they can see and write or draw them down. Now ask them to try this activity again but this time ask them what they can hear? Write or draw these down. Ask your child to help find a piece of material in the house and then blindfold them. What can they see? Which sense do they use now? Ask them to now cover their ears and look outside the window. What do they hear?

Find a place in the house. Look around what they can see. Sketch what they can see. What is on the left hand side of them? What is the right hand side of them? Does it change if they sit in another part of the house? Make a list of all the things and compare.

Look at our school logo. What does the current logo represent? Look at the shape, colour and design. How could it be changed to show the values of our school? Could you design a new logo?

Phonics

Keep practising your phonics. This can be done by:

- Write words containing 'ai', 'ay', and 'a_e'.
 Can you sort them into columns?
